

For Safety and Risk Managers:

Are You at Risk?

A recent U.S. Department of Labor enforcement memo directs compliance officers to check and verify that safety training is provided in a language that the workers can understand.

- Employees may not understand essential safety information and may not be able to implement it properly if they don't speak English
- Compliance violation fines and retraining can be very costly.
- Fatal work injuries involving Latino workers has reached the highest level ever recorded.
- Down time and damages resulting from errors and accidents can have disastrous financial consequences for both worker and employer.
